Let's leave the mainland of Italy and take a little trip to an island, just off the coast of Naples, called Procida. The harbor city is Corricella, the oldest village on the island--far prettier than glitzy Capri and with less tourists.

This rainbow-like fishermen's village on the island is a vision in pastels, with its pretty buildings in gelato-colors going down the hill to a shocking blue sea. Corricella is by far one of the most colorful places you will ever discover. And, it was the setting for two memorable films: *Il Postino* (The Postman) and the *Talented Mr. Ripley*.

It's peaceful and attractive—and very few cars makes it even better! Limited exhaust fumes, noise, and no dodging cars constantly like a bull at a bullfight! Get away from the madness of Rome and the beehive of activity in Naples. Sorrento is packed with people and gift shops so this is a peaceful haven that allows you to slow down and regroup.

What can you do? Get an Aperol spritz, sit in the sun while you slurp down a dish of spaghetti with sea urchin (a local specialty), and watch the boats bob in the water.
