October is National Pizza Month.

There are approximately 61,269 pizzerias in the U.S. so there's absolutely no excuse not to order at least ONE pizza during October. The international pizza expo in March is the world's largest pizza industry show. But don't hurry to book a flight to Vegas in an attempt to taste a bunch of pizzas. It's not open to the public--only to pizza people like pizzeria owners, distributors, etc.



Americans eat approximately 250 million pounds of pepperoni a year. Women are twice as likely as men to order a vegetarian pizza--not pepperoni.

The most popular pizza topping in the United States is pepperoni, followed by mushrooms, sausage, ham, and green peppers.

The average American eats about 46 slices, or 23 pounds, of pizza per year.

Finland's Pizza Berlusconi is topped with smoked reindeer. Brazil's toppings include green peas, corn, and hearts of palm. Australia uses kangaroo, emu, and crocodile meat. Hawaiian pizza was not invented in Hawaii; it was created in Canada.



The average pizzeria uses roughly 55 pizza boxes per day. The most popular pizza size in the United States is 14". In Italy, they don't share; everyone gets their own pizza--about 13" in size and it's eaten with a knife and fork.



Domino's delivers the most pizzas in the world, at over a million pizzas per day.




The five most popular pizza days are Super Bowl Sunday, New Year's Eve, the Wednesday before Thanksgiving, New Year's Day, and Halloween.
